

M. A. History (Previous) 1st Semester + 2nd Semester

Programme Outcomes

- Student will learn basic narrative of historical events, personalities and turning points of history of India, World and Haryana.

Paper- I

Program Specific Outcome (Medieval Societies)

1. Students will learn transition from ancient society to medieval Society.
2. Students will get knowledge about the organization of non agricultural production under feudalism.
3. Students will be able to demonstrate the evolution of Islamic state from pious caliphs to the Abbasids.

Paper- II

Program Specific Outcome (Modern World)

On the completion of course students will be able to:


1. Understand the transition from feudalism to capitalism in Europe.
2. Learn about old colonial system and its consequences Rise of Liberalism, French Revolution and working of League of Nations.
3. Get knowledge of Rise of Fascism, World War II and UNO world peace.

Paper- III

Colonial India (opt.- ii) [1757-1857]

Students will be able to:

1. Understand the background of consolidation of the colonial power.
2. Acquire the knowledge about the sources of archival records and rise of the colonial state.
3. Know about the British Imperialist ideology- political, Economic and cultural theories.
4. Analyze the Pre-1857 risings and the uprising of 1857.


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Paper- IV

History of China in Modern Times-I

Students will:


1. Know about the shaping forces of modern China.
2. Know about the Taiping Revolt and the boxes uprising
3. Know about the rise of the communist party.

Paper-V

History of Europe- I (1789-1871)

It will help the students to have the ideas about major trends of Modern Europe. This curriculum teaches three major areas:

1. Familiarity with aspects of French Revolution from 1789-1871.
2. Major political events of congress of Vienna and Reconstructions of Europe.
3. Society and economy in 19th century Europe.

IV Semester
Approaches History of India

1. Meaning, nature and scope of history and allied disciplines.
2. Early trends of Historiography and medieval Historiography.
3. The idealistic approach, the materialistic approach with special reference to Karl Marx.
4. Historiography on lower castes' movements.

History of Haryana

IV Semester
History of Haryana

1. Students will gain knowledge about social institutions and social life, Economic conditions and industries of Medieval Haryana.
2. Students will acquire the knowledge of national Movements in Haryana.
3. Students will be able to explain the establishment of British rule in Haryana and the uprising of 1857.


Modern India 1858-1947

1. British company's territorial expansion in India and its administration. Economic and social policies.
2. Effects and response to colonial rule and foreign relations.
3. Process of modernization, growth of Bengali and Hindi literature and cultural renaissance.

Social History of India (1200-1947)

Students will be able to know about:

1. Sources and approaches of social History of India, Medieval urban and Rural society.
2. Position of women, educational system. The British social policy and social reforms.
3. Social change in India like rise of new social classes, transition in caste ridden society, changing position of women etc.


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Economics History of India (1200-1947)

The course teaches the students:

1. Sources of medieval and modern Indian Economic theory.
2. Economic basis of medieval Indian state.
3. Laissez- Faire and rise of capitalism, flow of foreign capital and its impact, rise of modern industries and drain of wealth.

Indian national Movement (1885-1947)

IV Semester

The course will:

1. Focus on emergence of Indian Nationalism, partition of Bengal and the Swadeshi movement.
2. Focus on rise of communalism and national movements.
3. Cover the politics of swaraj party, second phase of revolutionary movement and Indian national army.
4. Also cover the rise of the demand of Pakistan partition and independence.

Socio- Religions Movements in India (1200-1947)

IV Semester

The students will get knowledge of


1. Impact of Islam on Indian Society, religious cults of Islam in Early Medieval India.
2. Ideology of Sufi and bhakti movements, rise of silsilahs and panths.
3. Socio religious movements like Brahmo, Arya, Samaj, Ram Krishan Mission, Aligarh movement etc and protest movements.

Business History of India (1200-1947)

IV Semester

The students will be able to understand:

1. Trade and commerce, indigenous Banking system in Pre-colonial India.
2. East India Company's trade during 1757-1883 and its business interests in India.
3. Expansion of trade and business of Britishers in India, Modern Banking System, national Planning committee and the 'Bombay Plan'


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
